LMC meeting – April 13th, 2021

The committee met on the evening of April 13th via Microsoft Teams. The recent HSJ article on workforce ethnic discrimination findings at Tameside and Glossop Integrated NHS Foundation Trust was a substantive agenda item. We were delighted to welcome Roger Kline, Research Fellow at Middlesex University and expert in Workforce diversity, as our Guest Speaker. Roger summarised the findings of the recent WRES (Workforce Race Equality Standard) report and suggested ways of improving the situation at Tameside Hospital, by looking to change procedures and Board/Panel composition. Brendan Ryan, Tameside & Glossop Integrated Foundation Trust Medical Director was also in attendance, as was Dr Mirza, Consultant anaesthetist at Tameside Hospital and Dr Jaweeda Idoo, BAME Regional representative for GMHSCP. A discussion followed with Brendan Ryan, expressing disappointment at the result of the survey, taking ownership of the issue and resolving to put measures in place to improve the situation at Tameside and Glossop Integrated NHS Foundation Trust. The LMC will continue to engage with the ICFT and others to help reverse this trend and ensure patient and staff safety is assured.

Direct reimbursement

Dr Alan Dow, LMC Secretary, recently met with James Stafford, Lead Credit Controller at NHS Property Services, to discuss direct payments to GP practices going forward. The LMC generally support this approach and feel it would be beneficial for GP practices, removing the time involved in managing the current bureaucracy. Direct payments have the backing of DHSC and NHSE. Please find the attached summary of how payment flows will be improved going forward. Anyone wishing to implement this is advised to first discuss with one of the LMC officers and consider the extent of their existing arrangement/ contract with NHSPS/ CHS.

2WW referral process to T&G ICFT

The LMC are very concerned that the 2WW referral process has yet again been changed, slowing down the referral process for GPs as they adjust to another new way of working. We have flagged our concern with the ICFT and reminded them that there should be LMC consultation prior to system changes such as this.

My Way Diabetes - update

Further to the recent emails I sent, I have some ongoing concerns about the My Way Diabetes data sharing agreement, particularly around the proposed EMIS bulk upload. I shared my concerns with GMIGG (the GM Information Governance Group) and Jenny Spiers, GMIGG Chair and I met with the My Way Diabetes project team this week. We have advised the team to redo their DPIA (Data Protection Impact Assessment) using the GMIGG template, as this will draw out much more detail than the generic ICO template they had used. We are due to meet again in the next couple of weeks and in the meantime, I advise you not to sign the Data Sharing agreement via EMIS.
