NWRS Workforce Data Submission

A message from Gill Pilkington - Commissioning Project Manager Primary Care Workforce Development (Tameside):

As you are already aware part of the GMS (General Medical Services) 2017 contract and the HSCA (Health and Social Care Act) state that General Practice is required both contractually and legally to provide their workforce data. This data collection is in the form of the Northwest Reporting system (NWRS) which practices are expected to review on a monthly basis and amend accordingly, however I know this has been challenging throughout the Pandemic.

As discussed in various arenas this comprehensive data set is more than just a contractual expectation and is pivotal both locally and nationally in demonstrating the current and potential challenges that general practice is facing.

Through this data strategies can be developed to ensure there is a sustainable, increasing workforce to meet planned demand. We are also aware that this data set is used for some funding streams and has the potential to support other requests e.g., estates and IT.

Please can we ask that practices make this a priority if they have not accessed the NWRS in the last 2-3 months and ensure it is reflective of your current workforce as we are in the process of establishing submissions across Tameside general practice.

New COPI Notice

As previously flagged, the COPI notice expired on June 30th, 2022. However, another Notice on the COPI (Control of Patient Information regulations) has been served and is currently due to expire at the end of October 2022 but will probably be extended again. It is specifically intended to support the Covid-19 related research platform going forward. To this end, relevant data will be extracted from GP clinical systems and pseudonymised data will then be analysed to identify medical conditions and medications that affect the risk or impact of Covid 19 infection on individuals. That data will be retained in the secure research platform for two years for verification of analyses.

National Data opt Out compliance – 31st July 2022

The mandatory implementation of the National Data Opt-Out (NDOO) deadline has been extended until **31**st **July 2022**. As set out in the <u>Operational Policy Guidance</u>, the opt-out applies to the disclosure of confidential patient information for purposes beyond an individual's direct care across the health and care system in England, unless an exemption has been granted.

In advance of July 31st, you will need to update your practice privacy notice, as well as any policies and procedures referring to data processing. You also need to have a DPIA (Data Protection Impact Assessment) in place and I have attached the national template to meet this requirement. The onus is on the patient to register themselves, but you need to ensure that patients are aware of their options - you can access material/ resources here Information for GP practices - NHS Digital

Your clinical system suppliers should be releasing the MESH software (the messaging exchange for social care and health) in advance of the compliance deadline. I contacted EMIS who confirmed that their MESH solution was released in update 9.5.1 as inactive; it was activated on 7th March 2022. For ease of reference, I have attached further information from EMIS.

Deceased patient Records – Delayed contractual changes

NHSE/I have confirmed that the contractual changes for the management of deceased patient records have yet to take effect. This is due to required legislative and system changes remaining outstanding and means that practices should continue printing and sending the full records to PCSE until NHSE/I notifies the profession otherwise. PCSE will also retain the obligation to process AHRA requests it receives directly until that time.

Access to records programme – delayed to November 2022

In order to mitigate the risks associated with this programme of work, NHSE's Implementation team have now confirmed that the national switch-on for the Accelerating Access to Patient Records programme has now been further delayed until November 2022. Please see the following for further information.
