This is an exciting opportunity for a pharmacist to work in our Fracture Liaison Service (FLS) and award-winning rheumatology service. Pennine MSK Partnership is commissioned by Oldham Integrated care Systems (ICS) to provide rheumatology care (including FLS), orthopaedics (to the point of listing) and persistent pain services to the people of Oldham.

The post holder will carry out pharmacist-led rheumatology out-patient clinics to deliver patient education, monitor response to medicines and promote and deliver the best clinical practice in line with local and national guidelines. They will also be involved in the assessment of patients within the Fracture Liaison Service, referral of these patients for investigations and the provision of advice on treatment options.

Candidates are required to hold a Master of Pharmacy Degree or equivalent and be registered as a pharmacist with the General Pharmaceutical Council (GPhC). Evidence that the candidate has completed or is currently completing post-graduate clinical training is required (e.g. a clinical pharmacy diploma or equivalent foundation pharmacy framework training). Furthermore, an independent prescribing qualification is desirable, although the successful candidate will be supported in attaining this if not held.
